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Stained Glass Kites

Component: Art

Time: 30 minutes

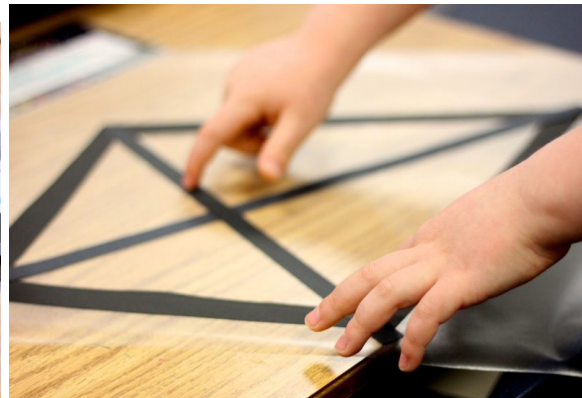
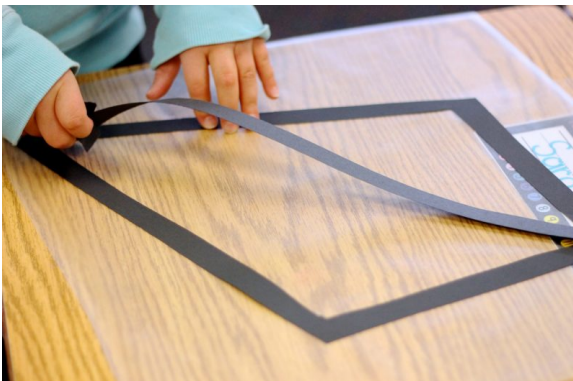


Materials:

- construction paper
- tissue paper squares
- clear contact paper
- scissors

Procedures:

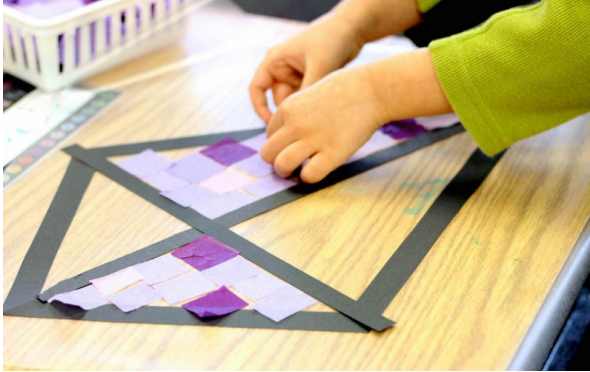
1. Cut the 1/2" frame for each kite from a 12×18" sheet of black construction paper.
2. Peel a 12×18" sheet of clear contact paper, placed it sticky-side-up and gently set a black frame on top of each sheet of contact paper.
3. Cut 1/2" strips that are 18" and 12" to complete the inside of the frame. Lay the two strips in a perpendicular way to connect opposite corners.





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4. Once the perpendicular strips are in place, fill in the four kite areas with tissue paper squares. Use only two colors. Matching colors will be in opposite sections of the kite.



5. Once the kites are completely filled with tissue paper squares put a second sheet of clear contact paper to "seal in" all the pieces and prevent the loss of stray tissue papers.



6. Use scissors to trim the excess plastic from around the kites.
