

Color Scavenger Hunt



This game gets kids thinking about the different colors all around them in their immediate environment and is fun and active as well!

Supplies:

- Various Paint Samples (can get them free from hardware stores or any store with a hardware/paint department) – it helps, but is not entirely necessary to have the samples with the little windows in them. If they are in strips, cut them individually by color

Directions:

1. You can do this a couple of ways, either break kids up into teams or have them do this activity individually
2. Hand out a paint sample to each kid (whether on a team or not)

3. Ask them to look around their environment and find a color that matches exactly to their paint sample (or as close as possible)
4. Once they have made the match they must either prove it to a staff by bringing the object and paint sample to the staff or if the object is larger or immovable, bring the staff to the object
5. The goal is to make as many successful matches as possible for either the team or the individual
6. If a certain color is proving too difficult, they may trade their sample in for a new one
